

Curriculum Information Leaflet Primary 2 Term 3 2025



Literacy

In term 2 in Primary 2, we will be continuing to develop our common words and phonics knowledge and will continue using word recognition strategies to help us read and identify words more easily. We will continue to enjoy daily opportunities for reading with our reading books, reading comprehension and our class library. Additionally, we will be exploring different aspects of grammar such as nouns, plurals, word banks and tenses.

In Talk for Writing we are starting to think about setting and will be using the story of The 3 Little Pigs to help us. We will be building up our knowledge of the story to be able to re-create it with our own twist!

We will also be continuing with our weekly spelling and dictation tests to strengthen our skills. There will be plenty of opportunities to practise listening and talking across the curriculum through class discussion, working with other classes and participating in game-based activities in both individual and group work.

At home it would be beneficial to engage with daily reading, ask questions relating to the book and aoina over sounds and common words.

Numeracy

This term in numeracy, we will focus on building a strong understanding of multiplication and division, which are essential skills for developing numeracy fluency. Pupils will engage in a variety of hands-on activities, games, and tasks designed to make learning these key number processes both enjoyable and meaningful opportunities for pupils to consolidate prior learning. Additionally, we will also be learning about data handling where pupils learn how to collect, organise, and interpret information in meaningful ways.

Daily mental maths practise will remain a core part of our routine, supporting pupils in developing speed, accuracy, and confidence in their mathematical thinking. These short, focused sessions provide regular o opportunities for pupils to consolidate prior learning.

Social Studies

This term, our topic is Knights and Castles. Pupils will explore life in the Medieval times, comparing and contrasting it with modern-day society to understand the dramatic differences in daily life, technology, and social structures. They will uncover the fascinating world of castles, exploring their features, purpose, and importance, as well as the vital role knights played in defending their kingdoms.

This IDL topic will seamlessly integrate various elements from across the curriculum, offering pupils a rich and immersive learning experience. Through hands-on activities, history will come to life in a dynamic and interactive way, allowing students to engage with the past in a meaningful and exciting manner!

Health and Wellbeing

In Health and Wellbeing, our primary focus this term will be on food and health. Pupils will develop an understanding of how to make safe and hygienic choices when preparing, handling, and storing food. They will learn about the importance of cleanliness and safety in the kitchen, exploring practices that ensure a healthy eating environment.

Additionally, we will delve into the relationship between food and overall health, helping pupils to understand the nutritional value of different foods and how balanced eating contributes to physical and mental well-being.

In PE, pupils will focus on developing their fitness and understanding of the human body. They will explore how exercise affects their bodies, learning about the importance of staying active to maintain a healthy lifestyle.

Religious and Moral Education

This term in Religious Education, we will be delving into the themes of Lent and Eastertide, exploring their importance in the Christian faith and the ways they are observed and celebrated.
