## Term 3

### Literacy

This term we are focusing on being able to retell familiar stories in the correct sequence. We will continue to develop our knowledge of single sounds/common words

#### How can I help at home?

Continue to read together, have your child retell the story in the correct order. Continue to practice weekly sounds/common

words



### Numeracy

This term we are focusing on addition and subtraction within 10 using concrete materials and a number line. We will learn number stories from 0 - 10

#### How can I help at home?

Recall facts for number stories from 0-10.



### Health and Wellbeing

This term we are focusing on our talents, strengths and our hopes for the new year.

#### How can I help at home?

Discuss any new year promises your child has made.

#### PE

This term we will be developing our gymnastics skills and will explore body shapes, jumps and rolls. We will create a short sequence using apparatus. Our PE days are a Wednesday and Friday. Children can come to school in their red polo shirt and shorts/leggings.



## RME

This term we are focusing 'Being Unique', Lent and Easter.

### How can I help at home?

Discuss how we all have different strengths/talents and our own personalities.

## Expressive Arts

This term we are learning the names of percussion instruments and how to keep the beat using them.

### How can I help at home?

Clap or tap to music at home or in the car to keep the beat.



## Science

This term we are focusing on forces by exploring toys that can be moved by pushing or pulling and how different surfaces can change how fast/slow they move



## Social Studies/IDL

This term we are exploring toys from the past and present.

### How can I help at home?

Discuss favourite toys at home and how they have changed over time. Can your child describe their toy and explain why it is their favourite?
