Term 4

Literacy

This term we are focusing on identifying texts that we like/dislike and giving reasons why. We will be focusing on how to spell common words correctly.

How can I help at home?

When you read together have your child pick different stories and tell you why they like or dislike the story. When reading identify common words.



Numeracy

This term we are focusing on money, being able to identify coins up to £2 as well as adding and subtracting different amounts.

How can I help at home?

When at the shops show your child the different prices of items. Let them pay for an item and get the change, check the change to see if it is correct.



Health and Wellbeing

This term we are focusing on food technology, how to prepare foods and using a variety of techniques e.g. chopping, mixing. We will also be exploring medicines and what is good for us and what can be harmful.

How can I help at home?

Have your child help prepare meals with you. Can they chop something?

PE -

Our PE days are a Wednesday and Friday. Children can come to school in their red polo shirt and shorts/leggings.

RME

This term we are focusing on Mary and people who care for us and the changing seasons from Spring to Summer.

How can I help at home?

Pray a Hail Mary together. Talk to your child about who helps to care for them, people at home, wider family and others such as their doctor. Play in the sunshine on a warm day and discuss what they can see/hear around them.



Expressive Arts

This term we will be focusing on cameras and taking photographs of nature.

How can I help at home?

Take a photograph of something you find beautiful or interesting. Look at it together and discuss.



Science

This term we are focusing on the ways people use science skills in their jobs.



Social Studies/IDL

Our local area, the weather and the farm.

How can I help at home?

Discuss the weather each day. Go for a walk around your local area, what can you see?
